Disaster Income Recovery Subsidy (QLD, NSW, VIC, SA, WA)	 their principal place of residence has been destroyed, or their principal place of residence has sustained major damage, or is unable to gain access to their principal place of residence for a period of 24 hours or more, or is stranded in their principal place of residence for a period of 24 hours or more, or their principal place of residence was without electricity, water, gas, sewerage services or another essential service for at least 48 hours (a utility failure) and the utility failure was caused by damage to public or private infrastructure, or is a principal carer of a dependent child who has experienced any of the above. Claims for this assistance can be lodged at Centrelink until 4 July 2011 as application for the payment is available for a period of up to six months. This payment is not taxable to the recipient. Disaster Income Recovery Subsidy consists of ex-gratia payments of \$469.70 per fortnight for single people and \$424.00 per fortnight each for a couple (equivalent to the maximum rate of Newstart Allowance). This payment is not means tested, however eligibility criteria include: must be living in or deriving income from an eligible area affected by the disaster have experienced a loss of income as a direct result of the disaster and can show evidence supporting this within 28 days of claiming , and not currently receiving another Centrelink payment. Special arrangements for lodgement of Centrelink forms	Centrelink has put in place special arrangements for customers in some regions who usually lodge their forms in person. They can do so over the phone, online or by post if they cannot attend their local Centrelink Customer Service Centre or Agent due to flooding. Taxation Assistance	 The ATO can offer the following assistance for individuals, small businesses and primary produces who suffer financial hardship as a result of a natural disaster: can fast track refund of tax return re-issue tax documents such as tax returns, activity statements, notice of assessments for those who have their records or documents lost or destroyed help to reconstruct tax records where documents have been destroyed taxpayers, including volunteers, may apply to the ATO for an extension of time to pay their tax debts or lodge documents and the ATO may waive General Interest Charge the ATO may consider request from a self-managed superannuation fund seeking additional time to meet its reporting obligations for businesses in one of the flood affected postcodes, the ATO will automatically defer the lodgement and payment dates for December monthly activity statements to 21 February 2011. 	INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES	
Personal Hardship Assistance Grant	This grant is a non-means tested one-off payment of \$170 per person , up to a maximum of \$850 for a family of five or more . Personal Hardship Assistance may be available to individuals and families who do not have the capacity to meet immediate, unexpected basic costs for food, clothing, medical supplies or accommodation caused by the disaster. To be eligible for this grant the person will need to establish that they have experienced, or will experience, personal hardship as a result of the disaster. Structural Assistance Grant	This grant is a means tested one-off payment of up to \$10,500 per individual, and up to \$14,200 for a couple/family , less amounts paid under certain other grants. This grant may be available to property owners whose home has been damaged by the disaster. The home must be uninsured for this disaster event, owned by the applicant and their sole place of residence at the time of the disaster. The grant provides a contribution towards repair of the residence to a habitable and secure condition. Essential Household Contents Grant	This grant is a means tested one-off payment of up to \$1,705 per adult , up to a maximum of \$5,120 for a couple/family . This grant may be available to people who own essential household contents that have been lost or damaged in the disaster and who do not have contents insurance. The application will be assessed on a case by case basis. Personal Hardship and Distress Grant	Potential measures include emergency food, accommodation, clothing, temporary living expenses, replacement of essential household contents and housing repairs to return housing to a habitable, safe and secure condition. Note – some of these measures are subject to income and means testing. The following assistance is available to individuals in affected areas: - Up to \$5,000 to assist with the reconnection of electricity. - Up to \$10,000 for the replacement of white goods and floors coverings. Clean up & recovery grants	 SMALL BUSINESSES AND PRIMARY PRODUCERS Grants of up to \$25,000 are available for primary producers and small businesses to pay for costs arising out of damage caused by the December/January 2011 flood: The grants are in two tiers and will consist of: Category C Tier 1 clean-up and recovery grants of up to \$5,000, not requiring proof of damage and expenditure; and Category C Tier 2 grants of up to \$20,000 for both primary producers and small businesses, including those in agricultural and pastoral industries, requiring proof of damage and expenditure. The cut-off date for lodgement of claim is 30 June 2011. These loans have a 2 year period where no interest or principal repayment is required. Temporary living expense	Temporary living expenses of up to \$865 per week per household for a maximum of 10 weeks for people whose principal residence is destroyed or inaccessible for more than one week and who do not have insurance. Flood/hail damage assistance loan	Loans of up to \$200,000 are available to eligible primary producers and small businesses whose properties have suffered direct damage as a result of the floods. Each case will be assessed on merit. Interest rate will be 2.8% p.a. for an initial period not exceeding five years. Flood/hail damage assistance grant	A one-off grant of up to \$15,000 may be available to small business owners and primary producers who have suffered direct physical damage for clean-up, removal of debris and business restoration. This grant is not income tested however, it is a discretionary payment and subject to eligibility criteria. Note - application must be made by 31 May 2011.
